Petit Chenin Blanc <i>Ken Forrester Wines, Western Cape, South Africa 2019</i>	5.40	7.30	9.50	28
Without the efforts of men like Ken Forrester, South African Chenin Blanc might be scarcely more than a footnote to the country’s recent winemaking history. The undisputed “King Of Chenin” saw the wines excellent quaffability and the grape is now a great characterful crowd pleaser and a huge export for South African wine. Fragrant, light with balanced acidity, a delight for summer alfresco dining.				

Alma de Blanco Godello <i>Pazo des Tapias, Spain 2019</i>				29.50
This rare grape was nearly extinct but now sits alongside Albarino as one of Spain’s premier whites. A fascinatingly complex white reminiscent of Viognier.				

Land Made Sauvignon Blanc, Yealands <i>Marlborough, New Zealand 2020</i>	5.85	8.05	10.65	30.50
The winemakers have chosen to allow the land to tell its own story, selecting parcels of grapes carefully nurtured from the vine to the bottle, resulting in a wine of great character and class				

Mas Que 2 (Albariño Loureiro Treixadura) <i>Spain 2018</i>				30.50
A complex yet appealing blend of indigenous white grapes from Rias Baixas: Albarino gives power to the blend, Loureiro gives elegance, Treixadura gives aroma.				

Saint Clair, Pinot Gris <i>Marlborough, New Zealand 2016</i>				31.95
Saint Clair was established by the Ibbotsons, viticultural pioneers in Marlborough since 1978, creating world class wines. Aromas of freshly baked bread crust straight from the oven, with fragrant ripe pear. Finely structured with a rich, silky mouthfeel & dry finish.				

Gavi di Gavi, La Minaia, Nicola Bergaglio <i>Italy 2019</i>	6.70	9.10	12.25	35
Gavi has been dubbed the “Chablis of Italy”, due to its fresh, steely minerality. Not to be confused with bog standard Gavi, this is made in the actual village where much stricter regulations are imposed, resulting in a wine of great class.				

Chablis, Joseph Drouhin <i>Burgundy, France 2019</i>	8.20	10.90	14.80	42.50
Chablis is famous for its dry, minerally Chardonnay. The limestone soils of Chablis allow for the production of truly world class wines of which this is no exception. Dry & steely with flavours of lemon & honey offset by a certain richness & complex finish.				

Sancerre, Domaine Franck Millet <i>Loire, France 2019</i>				45
A seriously stunning textbook Sancerre. Great complexity with the classic minerality so traditional of Sancerre & all exhilaratingly fresh gooseberry flavours that you could ask for.				

Meursault, Domaine Jean-Michel Gaunoux <i>Burgundy, France 2017</i>				68
Well developed with ripe, tropical fruit on the nose & an enticing note of honey leading to an intense & concentrated palate with well-balanced acidity & a crisp, clean, lengthy finish. Chardonnay at it’s very best!

Intense red with violet reflections, intense aromas of preserved fruits, black cherries and currant. Elegant, fruity and full bodied. Food Match: with spicy pasta, grilled meat and poultry.				
Negroamaro del Salento, Varvaglione <i>Italy 2017</i>				30.50
This winery concentrates on enhancing indigenous varieties, in this case Negroamaro, a grape native to Southern Italy. The nose offers fascinating scents of wild berries. The palate is marked by vanilla with a long lingering finish & a velvety texture.				
Primitivo della Puglia, Botromagno <i>Italy 2019</i>	6.30	8.60	11.40	32.50
Legend has it the ancient Primitivo grape was drunk at The Last Supper. This unoaked wine is full, rich & intense but retains it's elegance & delicate scent.				
Alberca Single Estate Malbec <i>Mendoza, Argentina 2019</i>	6.40	8.70	11.50	33
The most popular red grape sold in the UK last year & what a cracker this is, deep red almost purple in colour. Wonderfully aromatic with lifted violet, red currant & cassis notes. The finish is silky smooth with soft tannis and refreshing acidity.				
The High Trellis Cabernet Sauvignon d'Arenberg <i>McLaren Vale Australia 2016</i>				35
From a highly regarded family owned winery, if big, rich and juicy is your thing, this wine does not disappoint. A great alternative to Malbec to partner red meat.				
Land Made Pinot Noir, Yealands <i>New Zealand 2018</i>	6.80	9.20	12.30	36
The region may be best known for it's Sauvignon Blanc but the Pinot Noir grape truly reflects the islands soul. Charming, approachable yet refined, where juicy ripe red fruit flavours lead into a supple, soft tannin finish.				
Rioja Reserva, Ramón Bilbao <i>Spain 2015</i>				42
Reserva Rioja requires a minimum of 3 yeas total ageing in cask & bottle before release, resulting in a sumptuous & classical wine with notes of blackberries, cedar, leather & spices. Good balance on the palate with a long finish.				
Péssac-Léognan Rouge, Château Valoux <i>Bordeaux, France 2017</i>				47
Toasty, aromatic red Bordeaux, beautifully balanced, the mouth packed with blackberries and black cherries. Made from 20% Merlot and 80% Cabernet.				
Barolo di Serralunga d'Alba DOCG, Fontanafredda <i>Italy 2014</i>				65
The current holders of Wine Spectator's "European Winery of the Year" Fontanafredda has made this superb, complex, velvety, well balanced Barolo made from the Nebbiolo grape variety.
